

## **REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS**

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## **POLICY**

Registrants of NSCMIRTP must meet the criteria as set out in this policy to be approved for a license to work as a medical imaging and radiation therapy professional (MIRTP) in the province of Nova Scotia.

## **RATIONALE**

As the regulator for MIRTs in the province of Nova Scotia it is the mandate of NSCMIRTP to ensure those granted a license to practice have met a minimum standard. This standard ensures all MIRTPs have the requisite knowledge, skills, judgement, and good character to provide the public with competent professional care.

## **PROCEDURE**

As outlined in the registration documents all applicants must provide required proof of meeting the following standards;

- Successful completion of an approved program in the specified discipline(s).
- Successful completion of an approved entrance to practice examination(s) in the selected discipline(s)
  - For applicants educated outside of Quebec this will be either CAMRT or Sonography Canada entrance to practice exams
  - For those completing a Quebec MIRT education program, this will be either the CAMRT, Sonography Canada or the Ordre des Technologes en Imagerie Medical en Radiooncologie et en Electrophysiologie Medicale du Quebec (OTIMROEPMQ) exam(s).
- · Copy of government issued photo ID
- Documentation of name change if current name does not match submitted documents
- · Legal entitlement to work in Canada
- · English Language proficiency in reading and writing
- · Good Character via submission of a clean vulnerable sector check and clear internet search
- Clinical practice hours within the past 5 years
- · Evidence of sufficient personal professional liability insurance
- · Successful completion of NSCMIRTP jurisprudence module
- · If transferring from another regulated jurisdiction, CFTA form
