
Please accept this correspondence in support of \_\_\_\_\_ application for licensing as a Medical Radiation Technologist (MRT) in the province of Nova Scotia, pursuant to the Medical Imaging and Radiation Therapy Professionals Act, S.N.S. 2013

MRTs are regulated health professionals in Nova Scotia who perform diagnostic and therapeutic procedures, some of which can be invasive, on individuals. Their scope of practice includes providing health services to seniors, adults, adolescents, and children, in health care clinics, healthcare facilities, and correctional facilities. MRTs regularly work with the vulnerable members of society and are in a significant position of trust with respect to their patients.

MRTs are licensed and regulated by the Nova Scotia College Medical Imaging and Radiation Therapy Professionals (NSCMIRTP). The Board of the NSCMIRTP requires all applicants to the College, pursuant to Policy CR-016-01, to obtain a current Criminal Record Check and a Vulnerable Sector Check. This is a licensing requirement for all potential registrants of the College due to the high degree of trust and responsibility inherent in their work. In order to fulfil our role as a public interest regulator, we are required to satisfy ourselves that our registrants are of good character, are fit to practice the profession, and do not present a known safety risk to the public.
